The program was presented by Kara Elaine Hofstede, an author and illustrator, and former teacher. She talked about how her ideas for stories become reality and how she overcame her learning disability to become a successful children's author. She shared a short synopsis of her first book, Panta Mimi, which she wrote and illustrated.

A short meeting was held following Kara's talk. Minutes published in the Newsletter were approved as printed. Betty Hanlon presented and explained the Treasurer's Report which was filed for audit. Our community service project, the children's book collection, will continue through the November meeting. (We are asking for new children's books to be donated so that they can be given to a school that was impacted by Hurricane Harvey.) Information was shared concerning members or previous members of the group. Beth Eardley sent a letter informing Lambda Gamma that she is resigning as a member. It was voted by the members to accept with regret her decision, with an emphasis that she can resume her membership at any time. An announcement was made that Jane Gray, a former member, lost an aunt on October 17, and that we should keep her family in our prayers.

Following the meeting, many of the members purchased copies of Kara Hofstede's book, <u>Pana Mimi</u>, which Kara autographed.

The winner of the door prize was Kara Hofstede. She was excited to receive the prize, which was a fused glass ornament made by the clients at Reach Unlimited.

- A newly established DKG Constitutional Amendment (Article III, Sec. B. 4) concerning membership establishes the "Collegiate Member" classification. A woman graduate student or undergraduate junior or senior student enrolled in a college or university who is pursuing a degree in education and intends to continue academically and professionally in the field of education may become a Collegiate Member of DKG!
- From the website, <u>www.dkg.org</u>: "The name 'Delta Kappa Gamma' is a combination of the initial letters of three Greek words: Διδασκαοι—Didaskotikai meaning teachers; Κλειδουχοι—Kleidouchai meaning key; and Γυναικεz— Gynaikes meaning women." Today we use 'DKG' as the name of our Society. We are Key Women Educators.
