

#### Minutes of Lambda Gamma Meeting – April 16, 2019

The meeting began with a welcome by President Huntyce Moore, after which she recognized and thanked the hostesses from Group A. Cares and concerns were followed by a prayer.

A delicious dinner was served which was enjoyed by all.

A dual program, entitled "A Look into Cambodia and Thailand" was presented by Amanda Cargill and Victoria Fairleigh. Amanda shared pictures of Cambodia from her travels there as she told about her amazing experiences travelling and seeing various exotic sights in that country. Victoria shared her heartwrenching stories about her past life in Cambodia, her immigration into the United States, and her reflections on her experiences.

The business meeting was called to order by Huntyce. Amiee Modic gave the thought for the day. The minutes of the previous meeting, which were printed in the Newsletter, were approved as presented. The treasurer's report, also printed in the Newsletter was reviewed by Betty Hanlon. She stressed that we need to improve our fundraising in the next year and find more projects that tap sources of funds from outside our own membership. Dues for 2019-20 were collected.

New business: The State Convention will be June 20 – 23 in Arlington. Lambda Gamma members who will attend are Evelyn Bray, Sue Bathe, and Martha Steele.

Also under new business was a discussion about our Grant-in-Aid. Various ideas were brought up as to how we can implement the new plan we approved (of awarding the grant monies to teachers in their first year of teaching, rather than to a graduating high school senior pursing a major in education.). The members agreed to have the Executive Committee meet with the Grant-in-Aid committee to work out a proposal for procedures, policies, and timeline for awarding a Grant. The committee will report back at the September 2019 meeting.

Members agreed to postpone the Induction Ceremony for Victoria Fairleigh and Becky Ison until the fall, 2019, since the meeting ran longer than our usual adjournment time.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:20.

#### Minutes of Executive Board Meeting – July 8, 2019

The officers of Lambda Gamma met for a planning meeting with a brunch on July 8, 2019 at the home of Martha Steele. In attendance were: Huntyce Moore, President; Amanda Cargill, 2<sup>nd</sup> VP; Betty Hanlon, Treasurer; Martha Steele, Corresponding Secretary; Val Steele, Immediate Past President. Not in attendance was Evelyn Bray, Secretary, ( who was out of town on vacation).

The following items were discussed:

#### Chapter Meeting plans for 2019-20 and discussion:

- o Meeting dates were tentatively set for: Sept. 17, Oct 15, Nov.19, Dec.10, Jan. 21, Feb. 18, Apr. 21, May 12; subject to membership approval and availability of venue.
- o Suggested Schedule / Format for meeting: 5:15 Gather/Social time; 5:30 Dinner; 6:00 Program; 6:30 Business Meeting.
- Hostess group list was adjusted to include new members being inducted and omitting members who have resigned or transferred. This list will be presented to members for approval at the Sept. meeting.
- New Idea: Sunshine Person One member each month will volunteer to contact member who were not in attendance by email or phone call to tell them they were missed and give them the date of the next meeting.
- o Location of meeting: We received news that the Covenant Lutheran Church building was listed for sale in July. (The present smaller congregation is not able to support the upkeep of the large buildings.) Martha will check with the administration of the church to get more information in relation to our group continuing to meet there. Amanda will check with her new principal about meeting at Lieder Elementary as a backup location.

#### Membership:

- o Current membership is 20 active and 4 Reserve. All dues are in.
- o Prospective members: Sarah Hoffman (visited a meeting last year); Lenesha Jones (she responded she cannot commit now, as she is in grad school at this time); Kara Hofstede (author who spoke at a meeting); Miriam Crosby (Neighbor of Amanda Cargill, new Spanish teacher in first year of teaching at Cook Middle School (CFISD); Andrea Montano (just moved to Houston from El Salvador, music teacher at Nottingham Country Elementary (KISD) in first year of teaching)
- o Membership recruitment will be a priority goal of the chapter for this year.

#### Grant-in-Aid

- New process needs to be outlined (Change from awarding grant to graduating H.S. Senior(s) to awarding grant to beginning first year teacher(s) This motion was approved by the members in Spring, 2019.
- o Prospective candidates for Grant: Miriam Crosby and Andrea Montano both are first year teachers.
- o Discussion of ideas for this new grant process. Val will summarize ideas into a draft plan and refer it to the Grant committee to come up with a full draft plan.
- o Grant committee members will meet to work on the plan with the Executive committee input, and submit the proposal of new grant procedures at the September meeting.

#### **Finance**

- o Betty H. gave a treasurer's report
- Oconvention expenses: \$300 paid to convention attendees Martha Steele and Evelyn Bray. (total \$600 as per budget.) Sue Bathe waived a portion of the convention fund \$ since part of her expenses were paid by State since she served as Area Coordinator.
- o \$100 donated to Covenant Lutheran Church for building usage.
- o Fundraising will need to be a top priority all year.
- o Fundraising ideas discussed: Learning Express Toy Store sale Day, Kendra Scott Jewelry sale day, publish and sell a cookbook, organize a service project and apply for ASTEF project stipend

## PROPOSALS FOR PROCEDURES FOR LAMBDA GAMMA GRANT and TIMELINES from the GRANT COMMITTEE

Grant Committee: Huntyce Moore, Val Steele, Martha Steele, Amiee Modic, Christine Wyatt The following members of the Executive Board were consultants with the Grant Committee to write these proposals: Amanda Cargill and Betty Hanlon.

#### Part 1: GRANT PROCEDURES FOR 2019, (only)

- The Grant Committee proposes that two grants of \$400 each be awarded in September 2019 to two teachers in their first year of teaching. The monies will come out of the current Grant-in-Aid Fund raised in 2018-19.
- The two candidates nominated by the Grant Committee are Miriam Crosby who teaches at Cook Middle School (CFISD), and Andrea Montano who teaches music at Nottingham Country Elementary School (KISD). The 2019-20 schoolyear is the first year of teaching for both ladies. Miriam was recommended by Amanda Cargill. Miriam and Amanda are neighbors. Andrea was recommended by Huntyce Moore. Andrea is from El Salvador and is a Scholarship Singer in the choir at Grace Presbyterian Church with Huntyce.

#### • TIMELINE:

- August, 2019 Invite the Grant Candidates to the Lambda Gamma (LG) Meeting on Sept. 17.
- Sept. 17, 2019 (Lambda Gamma Meeting) While the LG members have their business meeting to vote on the Grant plan, Amanda Cargill (LG Membership Chair) will conduct a private orientation about membership in DKG with Miriam and Andrea. If the LG members approve the Grant Plan for 2019, the Grant monies (the amount decided by the membership) will be awarded to Miriam and Andrea that evening.
- October, 2019 (date to be determined, preferably before LG meeting date Oct. 17) Several Lambda Gamma members will attend a faculty meeting at Cook Middle School and at Nottingham Country Elem School to speak to the faculty to 1) honor and recognize the grant recipient(s), 2) offer information brochures about DKG, Lambda Gamma, and the benefits of membership, and 3) invite all faculty members to the Oct. 17 LG meeting. (RSVP will be required so we know number of guests for the meal and seating at the meeting.)

#### Part 2: GRANT PROCEDURES FOR 2020 AND FORWARD

- Grant will be awarded to a first year teacher in Katy ISD in the odd numbered years and to a first year teacher in Cy-Fair ISD in the even numbered years.
- All teachers in the designated district who are in their first year of teaching are eligible for the Grant.
- Grant Applications will be made available at each school in the designated district for that year.
- The number of Grants and the dollar amount of the Grant(s) will be determined by recommendation of the Grant Committee, subject to approval by the membership of the LG Chapter.

#### • <u>TIMELINE</u>

- Feb. 1 A detailed letter about the Grant along with information about DKG and Lambda Gamma will be emailed to all principals in the designated district for that year.
  - Attached to the email will be the Grant Application with instructions and the Lambda Gamma information brochure. (see attached)
- Aug. 1 A reminder email will be sent to the principals in the designated district with another copy
  of the Grant Application and LG brochure, and a letter encouraging principals to make the
  application available to the first year teachers at the school.
- Sept. 1 Applications are due to Lambda Gamma Grant Committee Chairperson
- Sept.-(during first 2 ½ weeks of the month) Grant Committee will review applications and choose recipient(s).
- Sept. Grant committee will contact principal of school(s) of grant recipients and arrange a date at a faculty meeting or inservice for LG representatives to visit.
- September LG Meeting (3<sup>rd</sup> Tues.)- Recipient(s) will be invited to the LG meeting to receive their Grant \$.
- Between Sept. and Oct. LG Meetings Several Lambda Gamma members will visit a faculty meeting or in-service at the school(s) of the Grant recipients. LG members will speak to the faculty to 1) honor and recognize the grant recipient, 2) offer information brochures about DKG and Lambda Gamma and the benefits of membership, and 3) invite all faculty members to the Oct. LG meeting (RSVP required.)
